## NOTE ON CATALOGUING

The Kahn collection has been arranged into 42 subject sections for the purpose of cataloguing.

These sections are listed at the beginning of the appropriate catalogue volumes.

Each item in the collection has been catalogued in a standard manner; annotative material, where necessary, appears at the end of the catalogue entry and is signalled with the mark "::",

The accompanying index volume will help locate any item in the collection by either author or title; in addition there is a chrononogical index of items in the collection up to the date 1900.

Although the catalogue has been carefully proof-read, the nature of the undertaking and the speed with which it has been carried out mean that there will inevitably be typographical errors, but it is believed that none is significant.

#### BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE

Dr. Kahn has kindly supplied the following memoir: -

## AUTOBIOGRAPHICAL NOTES OF AN HAWAIIANA COLLECTOR

"Born in San Francisco in 1935, I was raised in the Bay Area. I received a B.S. from Stanford University in 1956 and an M.A. and Ph. D. from the University of Michigan in 1957 and 1961, respectively. All the degrees are in mathematics. After ten years as an actuary in New York City and four years in Los Angeles, I returned to San Francisco in 1975 where I opened my own actuarial consulting firm, P.M. Kahn and Associates, in 1977.

"I first visited Hawaii at the age of three with my family to visit my mother's relatives. Her grandfather, William Archeson Markham, came to Hawaii in 1847. In 1858 he settled at Hana, Maui, after his marriage to Konale Kapule from Kipahulu. About 1865 they removed to Honolulu where their elder daughter, Fanny, was born in 1866. In 1891 she married P.E.R. Strauch, a young German interested in the sugar industry who had come to Hawaii to visit cousins who owned sugar plantations in Kauai. After a brief stay on Maui, my grandparents returned to Honlulu in 1898 to enter the real estate business because of the expected land boom following annexation. Their younger daughter, Alexandrina, married Sigmund Kahn in Honolulu in 1913 and moved to San Francisco. Ties with my mother's family in Honolulu remained close, and we visited there often except during the war years.

"Conversations among the old folks about events in Hawaii stimulated my interest in Hawaiian history which led to the purchase of my first old book on Hawaii, 'Hawaii's Story by Hawaii's Queen', by Liliuokalani when I was 13 from Warren Howell, a San Francisco rare book dealer who was to become the major source for items in my collection until his death in 1984.

"Books on Hawaiian history led naturally to accounts of the early voyages to Hawaii which led, in turn, to books on natural history by scientists on these voyages. Although my first Hawaiian language acquisition was an 1843 Bible, it was only with the 1969 purchase of 50 items from the Hawaiian imprint collection of the late Sir Lester Harmsworth from Maggs Bros. of London that Hawaiian language material began to be an important element in the collection.

"A trip to Europe in 1960 brought me into contact with many English and Continental rare book dealers, such as Maggs Bros. and Francis Edwards in London, Chamonal in Paris, and Nico Israel in Amsterdam. These dealers

and others in London, Paris, Stockholm, Copenhagen, Moscow, Tokyo and Sydney were major sources of Hawaiian material over the next 30 years. I bought heavily also from dealers in California, New England and Hawaii during this period.

"Howell's interest in newspapers and Hawaiian imprints provided many wonderful acquisitions, particularly after his purchase of the Ostheimer collection in Honolulu.

"Since 1978 I have maintained an actuarial consulting office in Honolulu, and commuting regularly has provided opportunity to find rare items from private, local sources, particularly scarce and fragile Hawaiian language material and laws and government reports of the Hawaiian monarchy and republic. It has also provided an opportunity to be active in the Pacific Translators Committee of the Hawaiian Historical Society and as an Associate of the Bishop Museum Library".

The September number (p. 443) contains a notice of the return of the Resolution and the Discovery. Apart from the notice which appeared in the London Gazette and a few other papers, this contains one of the earliest available notices of Cook's death and is one of the very first works to mention the Hawaiian Islands.
